*I*f you are planning to pursue a career in teaching, consider the two-year transferable associate of arts in teaching program at **Ozarka College.** 



With tuition costs among the lowest in the state, your savings from the first two years of your bachelor's degree will make a big difference. There are also some incentives from the State for teachers in certain subject areas or rural locations. **Ozarka College** has articulation agreements with most four-year institutions so that your coursework will transfer in its entirety and you will enter the four-year program at the junior level.

If you are interested in elementary teaching from Pre-Kindergarten through Fourth Grade level, Arkansas Tech University in Russellville offers junior and senior level elementary education courses through a variety of formats for the benefit of the Ozarka College service area.

The newest opportunity for AAT students is in Teacher Education through a program with Arkansas State University at their Mountain Home campus for those interested in teaching on the middle school level. These courses will be delivered in a variety of methods, including compressed video, online and traditional face-to-face.

Requirements for this program include:

- Passing the Praxis I exam
- Overall GPA of 2.5 (3.0 in the program)
- Complete a minimum of 30 hours with a "C" or better in specific coursework.
- Complete the Career Decision Awareness inventory.
- Write a paper on philosophy of education. (*obtain complete requirements from the AAT Coordinator or Admissions office*)
