October GED Testing Schedule

The GED Test will be given at Ozarka College in Melbourne, Arkansas on October 3 & 11 at 8:30 a.m. in Room 516 of the Wyth Duke Adult Education Building.

The test will also be given at the following locations in October:

Mammoth Spring,	Simmons First National Bank	9:00 a.m.	Oct. 1 & 15
Mountain View	Ozarka College	9:00 a.m.	Oct. 2 & 16
Salem	Fulton County Courthouse	9:00 a.m.	Oct. 15 & 17
Ash Flat	Sharp County Courthouse	9:00 a.m.	Oct. 23 & 29

You must present an Arkansas photo ID, a Social Security Card, and proof of passing Practice Test scores dated within the last year. There is no cost to take the GED Test. However, if you plan on taking the test at any of these locations, you **MUST** register by calling Ozarka College at 368-7371 or 1-800-821-4335 before the day of the test. Because of increased demographic information needed, it will be necessary to allow two days for the testing.

New Endowment Established to Honor Robert Kalischer

The Ozarka College Foundation has focused its fundraising efforts for the last 18 months on new scholarship opportunities for students attending Ozarka College. President Dusty R. Johnston announced this week a gift of \$10,000 from Betty Campbell, who resides part time in Hardy, Arkansas, to establish an endowed scholarship honoring her late husband, Mr. Robert D. Kalischer.

Campbell, who is a native of Columbus, Ohio, says she wanted to honor Kalischer in this way because, "he was a true gentleman of high intelligence who was always kind and compassionate and a man of the highest ethical standards I have ever known." The scholarship will be awarded to an Ozarka

College student pursuing an education in the nursing field with preference given to a Hardy resident.

Campbell, who was a nurse herself stated, "When Robert was in poor health, he appreciated the nurses who took great care of him. I thought it fitting to award this to a student who is seeking a degree in the health care industry." She goes on to say, "He greatly valued the education he received at the University of Michigan and understood the importance of others obtaining an education. Since Ozarka does not offer specific degrees in his field of engineering or philosophy, and with the high demand for good nurses, I thought it perfect to honor him in this way."

The Robert D. Kalischer Memorial Scholarship will be awarded beginning in the Fall of 2008. Campbell stated she is hopeful that there are others in the area who are interested in establishing an endowment to honor a family member or friend through Ozarka College.


Drama Club to Present "The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe"

Upcoming Fitness Classes Include- Arthritis Exercise and Fitness Ball

Ozarka College will offer the "Arthritis Exercise" fitness course again in Melbourne and for the first time in Ash Flat beginning on Monday, October 22. The four main components of the class will be exercise, health education, movement activities and relaxation exercises.

This eight-week continuing education class will meet on Monday and Wednesday mornings from 10-11:00 a.m. through December 19. Fitness Center staff member, Clara Ballard along with center director, Holly Ayers will coordinate the class for persons who wish to increase joint flexibility and to maintain muscle strength.

Previous participants in this program benefited from increased functional ability and decreased pain from arthritis. This course will follow guidelines provided by the Arthritis Foundation Exercise Program.

Space will be on a "first come first served" basis and interested students should register in advance by contacting the Paul Miller Fitness Center at 870-368-2090, or email hayers@ozarka.edu. Course fee is \$25.00.



Ozarka College Paul Miller Fitness Center will again offer a six week beginning fitness ball class on Mondays and Wednesdays beginning Monday, October 22, 2007. Times for this class will be 5:15 – 6:00PM. Fitness Center Director Holly

Ayers describes the fitness ball class as a low impact exercise course designed to strengthen, tone and increase overall core muscles. "Exercises utilizing the fitness ball will help students develop their core strength and stability, motor control and muscle endurance without adding bulk."

Students will need to provide their own exercise ball from 55cm to 75 cm depending on individual height. They can be purchased through the fitness center at a cost of \$20.
