ABOUT the CNA credential and licensure in the state of Arkansas:

"The Arkansas Department of Human Services oversees the rules regarding CNA certification. According to the department, aspiring CNAs must attend at least 90 hours of training that has been approved by the state. After completing the required training, they must then complete a CNA competency exam offered by Headmaster LLP. This is a two-part test that consists of a computerized exam and a practical skills evaluation. Acceptable scores are required on both parts to obtain certification.

"The Arkansas Mock Skills are available to view on the Arkansas Nursing Assistant website, (https://hdmaster.com/testing/cnatesting/arkansas/AR_CNA_Home.htm) these skills are the pool of skills that the candidate may receive on the skills portion of the state exam. For the knowledge exam the last several pages of the candidate handbook will include a knowledge word bank to study, and on www.hdmaster.com there are questions of the day, a sample free test and sample tests to purchase."

Why should I get certified?

- It is a recognized credential that will strengthen your resume
- Without a valid C.N.A. license, you will not be able to work as a C.N.A.
- It is a pre-requisite to some L.P.N. and R.N. training programs

When, how, and where can I be certified?

Upon successful completion of the Basic Health Skills course (a 7 credit-hour, 16-week, hands-on skills class) and passing a criminal background check you may take the Headmaster certification exam. The certification exam consists of a skills test as well as a written test. *The non-credit CE courses are 3 and 9 weeks long and are not on a regular schedule; please reach out for more information* State testing is offered on all 3 Ozarka campuses upon completion of the training program and HLC course.

How much does the test cost? \$125 (if you have a job in a Long Term Care facility at completion of the program, and have not tested in the past, the testing fee will be waived with a letter of intent from the facility)

How can I pay for the test?

Suggestions:

- If you are receiving federal or state financial aid, plan in advance to reserve some of your Pell refund, student government loan disbursement, or other financial aid disbursement so that you have the funds available at the end of the semester. (Consider the cost of the test as part of the cost of your education—save money to COMPLETE your education.)
